One Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$115,000.00) of this appropriation will come from the Unassigned Fund Balance as of December 31, 2019 (surplus). The balance of this amount will come from a US Economic Development Administration grant of \$6,008,000 and \$1,387,000 in NH DOT funding. The funding for this article will require that no additional amount be raised from taxation. This appropriation is conditioned on receipt of sufficient State and Federal funding.
